

Short CV: Professor Jože Starič

Assoc. prof. Jože STARIČ, DVM, MSc, PhD, spec. builtrics received his veterinary degree from the University of Ljubljana, Slovenia, where he also pursued his doctoral thesis on the periparturient hypocalcemia early diagnostics and management, clinical training in ruminant medicine and surgery, and postgraduate research work. He joined the faculty of the Veterinary faculty at the University of Ljubljana in 2001, headed the Clinic for ruminants between 2013 and 2016, and since 2016 he is leading the Section for diseases and health care of ruminants. He is a subject leader and teacher for Diseases and health care of ruminants at undergraduate and postgraduate level (Ph.D. studies and specialization). His clinical and research focused to ruminant welfare, medicine and surgery, which are reflected in over 150 original research and professional publications as well as many more reviews and scientific abstracts. Currently, he is associate editor of the international peer-review journal Tropical Animal health and production (Springer). At the National veterinary institute of Slovenia, he is responsible for field diagnosing of reportable contagious ruminant diseases. He is a management board member and secretary-general of the Mediterranean Federation for Health and Production of Ruminants (FeMeSPRum). He has been participating and leading national and participating in international educational and scientific projects, many times leading the Slovenian team. One of his tasks has been promoting safer and effective ruminant handling for students, and employees in ruminant production, including search and rescue personnel.
